ASSOCIATES OF BIBLICAL STUDIES PROGRAM

The Associates of Biblical Studies program is often the starting point for many students and acts as a fundamental basis for those intending to enroll in the School of the Prophets Seminary College. The Core One course track is specifically structured to establish a shared level of biblical knowledge among students, establishing a solid and reliable foundation of truth..

The Acts of the Apostles
